I want to thank everyone for their support of Murupara Area School, in what has been a difficult year dominated by COVID-19. As we look forward to 2021, there are some changes that we want to let you know about.

To better meet the learning needs of our youngest students and those in the middle years of their schooling we have made some changes to the make up of our learning hubs. Nīoreore will now include students in Years 1 - 6 and will be in the bottom two learning spaces. This will allow us to deliver a learning programme with increased support for the development of oral language and reading. Kārangaranga now includes students from Years 7 to 10 and will be in the large learning space in what was the Year 9 and 10 space. We know this will let us deliver the best learning opportunities for our rangatahi in the middle years of schooling and this is why we are adopting this structure at Murupara Area School. Rangipō will now include Years 11 -13, our senior students who are focused on gaining their NCEA qualifications and on developing the skills and self-management needed for success wherever their future pathways take them.

I want to thank all my staff for the hard work, dedication and passion they put into supporting our ākonga. Teachers and support staff work together to support the learning of every child here at Murupara Area School and they often go above and beyond for our tamariki. I want to acknowledge the passing of Jude Robinson earlier this year, it is both a professional and personal loss for me but I take comfort in knowing she had a strong faith in god and will be safe in his arms. I am sad to say we are farewelling Brooke Aramoana-Arlidge, our Technology teacher, and Justin Timoti a teacher in Kārangaranga, both of whom have taken new jobs in Rotorua. They will be really missed and we wish them all the best.

I want to acknowledge and celebrate a very special person in this school - Miss Joan Toe Toe. Whaea Joan is retiring after 41 years of teaching and we are going to miss her enormously. She has been in the teaching service since 1978 and making a difference in lives of children for 43 years. I know that we have parents who were taught by Miss Toe Toe and whose children she is now teaching. It is an incredible contribution by any measure.

I will see you all on day one of 2021, Tuesday the 2nd of February, in uniform, relaxed, and ready for a great year of learning.
