

Kia ora,

Please take the time to read the newsletter as Term 2 is filled with wonderful learning and sporting opportunities for our tamariki. There is a focus for the first half of the term on wellbeing with the visit from Mike King last week, Pink Shirt Day today and Gumboot Friday next week.

Pink Shirt Day is part of a powerful movement to spread aroha and kindness and end bullying. I want to send the clear message that bullying is not OK so Kōrero Mai, Kōrero Atu, Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora – Speak Up, Stand Together, Stop Bullying!

Gumboot Friday is a fun way to raise money for kids' mental health. 100% of the gold coin donation from your child wearing their gumboots to school goes to counselling for young people by registered mental health practitioners so it is going directly to where it's needed: to young people getting the help and support they need, when they need it most.

We now have a school nurse here two days a week to provide specialised youth healthcare for our students. Our ongoing partnership with the Bay of Plenty District Health Board (BOPDHB), Community Dental Service (CDS), and Absolute Dental Rotorua (ADR) means that our rangatahi now have convenient access to oral health care services at the school through the Absolute Dental Mobile Unit.

Staying safe online is also a really important part of protecting our tamariki. I wanted to highlight the wonderful resources on netsafe: <u>https://www.netsafe.org.nz/advice/parenting/</u> This site is full of great practical advice for parents on how to keep your child safe when they are online so check out the "7 steps for whānau" from some great tips.

Here at Murupara Area School we want every child to feel safe, valued, and included because this is essential for their wellbeing. You are always welcome to make an appointment and come in an talk about any issues that arise with your child's teacher or the senior leadership team. We will have the tauira whakamura day later in the term and look forward to seeing you there to talk about your child's learning.

- 3) Everyone has 2 voices inside their head: critical and the angel.
- 4) No one has there stuff together not even adults or teachers.
