Kia ora koutou katoa, Welcome to 2024.

As always, we are looking forward to a wonderful year focused on learning and opportunity. We welcome our new staff and students. Whaea Erina Butterworth is working with us for Term one and is taking on Senior Curriculum Lead, working with staff on NCEA matters, Markbook set up, Kamar and Principal Nominee functions. Together our staff intend to make a difference with achievement across all areas, academic, sporting, and cultural.

Please make sure you have updated your email and cell phone number with your child's teacher as we will be sending out the newsletter via email. We also strongly encourage you to sign up to the Kamar parent portal and to regularly use this. The portal allows you to look at the school's calendar and keep up to date with all the events happening. You can also look at your child's attendance, timetable, student achievement and reports, and your school account. You can access this from the "Parent Portal" link on our webpage: www.mas.school.nz. To access this from your phone you need to download the kamar school app from itunes or google playstore. This is a free download. Set up Murupara Area School as your school by entering kamar.mas.school.nz in the settings in the box named portal address. You can then stay informed wherever you are!

There have been no issues with cellphones at school and we thank you our whanau for enabling a smooth transition. We also wish to notify a change to our attendance protocols. In future if your tamariki is absent intermittently during the week or is absent for a minimum of two days within the week or weeks, we will require a face- to -face meeting with whanau to explain absences. Going to town, sleeping in or it's my birthday are unjustified absences. The Ministry has set a target for 2024 of 70% of students attending school regularly. That is attending at least an average of 9 days a fortnight. In Term four of 2023 only 47% of our tauira met that target and what was more concerning is that 23% of our tauira were chronically absent, missing three or more days per fortnight. So, whanau please be advised of the new attendance protocol and help us get your tauira to school, not just to meet a target but to give our kids the best opportunities possible.

Thank you all for the wonderful turnout with our Pohiri at MAS and the solid support with our noho at Tipapa Marae. Big thanks to Whaea Miriama and Matua Muriwai and Matua Truby for your lead in these significant areas. We also give thanks to our kaumatua and Kuia that have supported us with our journey. The Hauora Day was held on Friday at MAS and was a memorable experience for all who participated. Thank you Whaea Julie and Whaea Mem for your vision and implementation of this day. Lastly, Friday we had Senior School Athletics. Whole School Swimming Sports is on the 28th of February and is another great opportunity to spend a fun day with your tamariki. Mā te wā,

TRADES PĀNUI

Futures Academy -Trades is fully underway for 2024, we have high numbers attending this year which shows our students are proactive towards their pathway.

Trades offers students the experience of hands-on, work relevant, learning that provides a strengthened pathway to apprenticeships, employment, or further trades training.

Our students will earn credits towards NCEA, so while planning a pathway they are achieving for today as well.

Students who try a trade while in high school, increase their chances of discovering their strengths and passions and can take early steps to focus their learning on related skills and knowledge.

Our year 11 students get the opportunity to get a brief taste of three different trades, experiencing a different one each term, attending one day a week.

Advanced courses are for our year 13 students, they offer more in-depth skills and theory-based training, where students can attain credits towards an industry certificate, or pathway directly into apprenticeships, trades employment or further training.

Shandi Mellon is our only year 13 attending trades, last year as a level 2 she achieved a merit in Automotive engineering, we know she will achieve high results this year as well. Shandi will attend trades two days a week continuing to train towards her level 3 Automotive engineering certificate.
